#### Extra-Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Last year at this time we had our first meeting and as you know, we made some changes. Thank you to all those who are following the new procedures! But we also still need to be mindful of some other things, i.e., please remember that you



are leaders of the community and people look to you to be good examples. And so, please remember, that after returning from offering the Eucharistic Presence (whether the Body or the Blood) to make the proper sign of reverence (either a bow or a genuflection) before returning to your seats. When ministering the Body or the Blood, please remember not to personalize it by saying "John or Mary or Claire the Body of Christ". While it may seem to be a friendlier way for those you know, it makes the people you don't know feel somewhat less. By personalizing the offering of the Eucharist you may so emphasize the personal dimension to the exclusion of the communal aspect. The word communio, means: "one with", and so our reception is not solely a personal experience but rather communal in nature, we all become one with the Lord and each other.
